

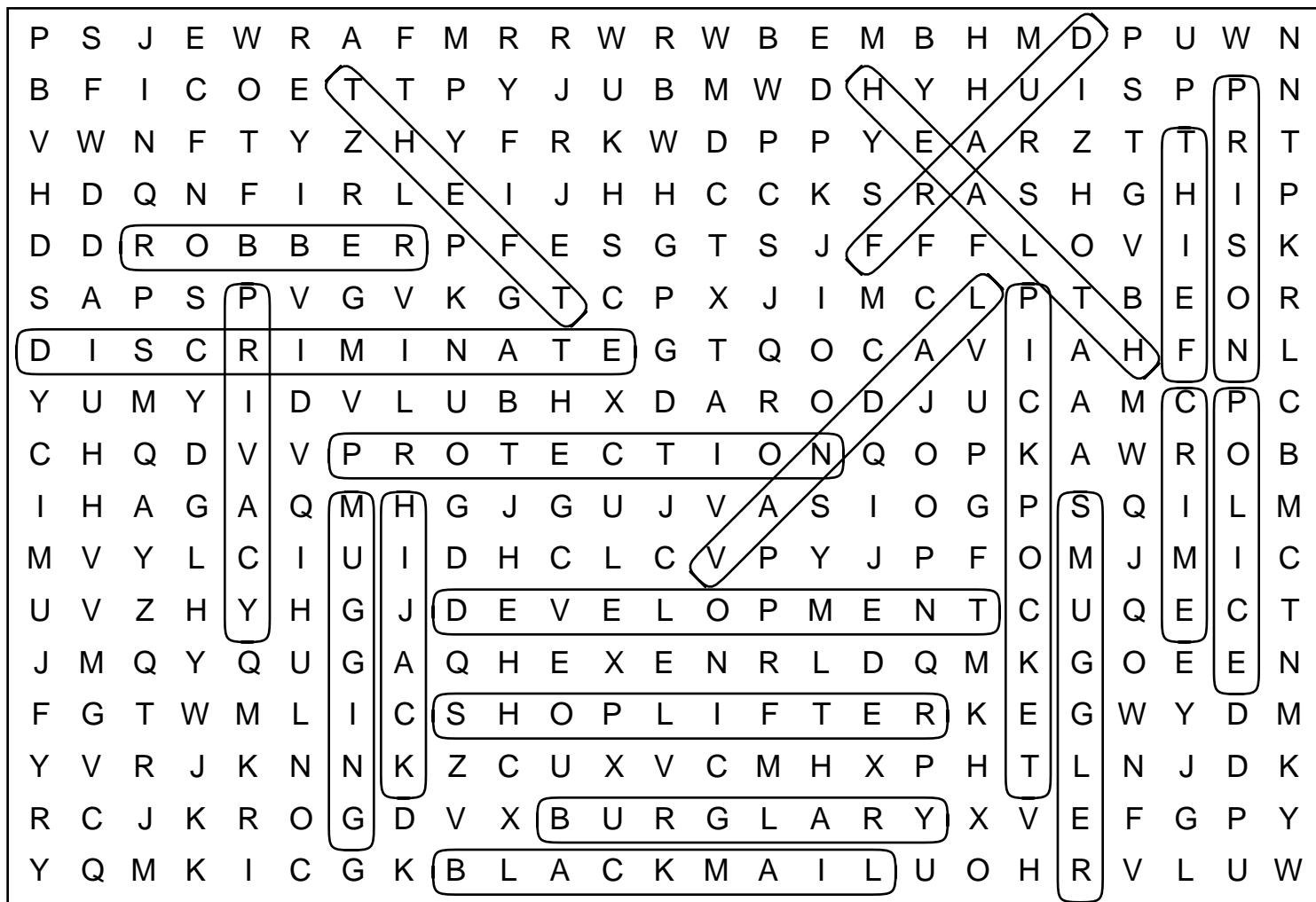

1. an act committed or omitted in violation of the law [CRIME]
2. the crime of forcibly entering a building with the intention of stealing [BURGLARY]
3. one who steals from pockets or purses [PICKPOCKET]
4. one who steals goods from a shop [SHOPLIFTER]
5. a person who intentionally destroys public or private property [VANDAL]
6. a person who steals [THIEF]
7. to rob with violence [MUGGING]
8. the quality or state of being away from others; seclusion [PRIVACY]
9. to take over the control of a vehicle or aircraft by force of arms, often for political aims [HIJACK]
10. to make a distinction; to give unfair treatment, esp. because of prejudice [DISCRIMINATE]
11. the act of protecting or state of being protected [PROTECTION]
12. something that has been developed or is being developed [DEVELOPMENT]
13. the state of being well [HEALTH]
14. the person whose duty it is to protect people and property and enforce the law [POLICE]
15. deceitful behaviour, dishonesty [FRAUD]
16. to get money or some advantage from people by threatening to tell secret information about them [BLACKMAIL]

17. the act of stealing [THEFT]
18. a person who takes something or somebody across an international border illegally [SMUGGLER]
19. a person who steals without permission, by force [ROBBER]
20. a large building where criminals are kept locked up, a jail [PRISON]
